Psalm 121 is one of the "Psalms of Ascent" — songs that were sung by the people of Israel as they made their way up to Jerusalem for worship. The Temple sat on a hill, so they literally had to lift their eyes as they climbed. But it wasn't just a physical movement. It was spiritual. It was a way of preparing their hearts — shifting their gaze upward — as they came to meet with God.

We still need that shift. Because if we're honest, our eyes stay glued to what's right in front of us. Our schedules. Our worries. Our deadlines. The noise of life. It's everywhere — constant notifications, endless needs, emotional clutter that pulls on our strength and leaves us stretched thin.

And without even realizing it, our souls start to run on empty. We show up to worship, but we're still carrying the noise. And somehow, even here, it's hard to catch our breath.

If that's you today, the psalmist has a word for you: Look up. Not just physically, but spiritually. Recenter. Remember where your help comes from. Your Keeper never sleeps. He hasn't forgotten you. And even when your strength runs out, He doesn't.

Let's lift our eyes together this morning — and remember the One who keeps us.




