Lately, I've been contemplating a quote by Thomas Merton: "There is a greater comfort in the substance of silence than in the answer to a question" (The Sign of Jonas). In this work, Merton journaled his experience as he entered a monastery and adjusted to the new rhythm of life. He suggested that true spiritual depth is not found in analytical answers or verbal clarity, but in silence—a presence filled, active silence. In this view, silence is not emptiness but a deeper communion with God. It's the space where our restless striving for explanations quiets, and we encounter something beyond words.

Rather than seeking comfort in answers, which are often temporary, limited, and intellectual, Merton proposed that silence itself becomes the spiritual answer where one is grounded in presence, humility, and surrender. It's the kind of silence Elijah experienced in the "still small voice" of 1 Kings 19:12. In the quiet whisper, Elijah found contentment and peace. In the wilderness and garden, Jesus embraced this quiet surrender.

Merton learned that questions arrive and then they disappear. They rise and fall like waves, but learning to embrace silence and a quiet surrender ushers the person into something more abiding—the presence of God. Learning to be comfortable with silence means stepping out of the cycle of needing to control, explain, or grasp. It is only then that one can rest in the mystery of things.

I have discovered the more I can live with mystery, the better attuned I am at seeing the beauty that is directly in front of me. Learning to be comfortable with silence helps me be fully present with those who cross my path.


