The soul is like soil—it grows whatever we plant in it. Over the last two weeks in our 8:30 service, we've learned that the practice of stillness clears the ground, creating space where God's promises grow louder than every other voice. Then came the practice of trust — trusting that even the painful and confusing parts of our lives are being woven by God into the likeness of Christ.

This week, we turn to the practice of Scripture. We don't open the Bible to check a box — we open it to be shaped by the voice of God. In a world where so many voices — outside us and inside us — try to write our story, Scripture calls us back to the one story that matters: God's story of love, redemption, and identity in Christ.

History reminds us how believers before us lived this out:

- John Newton called the Bible "the bank of heaven," a place to draw daily strength.
- Søren Kierkegaard compared it to a letter from a beloved meant to be read personally, not as distant information.
- Dietrich Bonhoeffer, facing Nazi Germany, insisted Scripture is God's living demand, calling us to obedience and costly discipleship.
- Dwight L. Moody, the 19<sup>th</sup> century evangelist, said, "The Bible will keep you from sin, or sin will keep you from the Bible."

John Wesley, our own father in the faith, called himself "a man of one Book." But he didn't mean that as an obligation. He meant it as devotion — returning again and again to Scripture as the living Word where he encountered the God who loved him.

This practice isn't about earning God's love. It's about remembering it. It's about letting God re-write our story so we no longer live by the lies of culture, shame, or fear, but by the truth that we are His beloved.


What my soul needs to practice this week: To return to God's Word daily and let it rewrite my story.


#### STUDIES & OPPORTUNITIES




