When the Bible speaks of light shining through God's people, it never suggests that holiness is ownership but reflection. Paul reminds us that the Christian life is not self-illumination but participation in divine radiance: "And we all, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another. For this comes from the Lord who is the Spirit" (2 Corinthians 3:18). The light we see in the saints is the life of Christ shining through ordinary human hearts.

C.S. Lewis captured this truth with striking clarity in The Weight of Glory: "If we let Him...He will make the feeblest and filthiest of us into a god or goddess, a dazzling, radiant, immortal creature, pulsating all through with such energy and joy and wisdom and love as we cannot now imagine; a bright stainless mirror which reflects back to God perfectly (though, of course, on a smaller scale) His own boundless power and delight and goodness." Lewis reminds us that redemption is not the polishing of our reputations but the transformation of our nature. The saints we honor on All Saints' Sunday were not perfect stars; they were mirrors. Their lives opened enough for God's light to pass through. Their holiness was participatory, not possessive. They became luminous because grace made them transparent.
