The earliest followers of Jesus understood something vital: faith does not grow by accident—it grows by devotion. Acts 2 tells us that the first believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teachings. This wasn't a casual interest, but a deliberate commitment. They built habits of study, prayer, and fellowship, repeating them day after day until they became the rhythm of their lives.

The discipline of study is about more than gathering information; it is about transformation. Each time we open Scripture, meditate on God's Word, or study together, we are shaping our minds and hearts to reflect Christ. Like any practice, repetition leads to formation. What begins as discipline eventually becomes delight, and what once felt like effort becomes our "new normal."

Maturation of faith happens this way. Through deliberate choices forged over time, we grow. Just as no athlete is formed overnight, no disciple matures without consistent practice. When we devote ourselves to study, we are choosing the long path of growth. These repeated habits build a life where the Spirit's voice is more familiar, God's wisdom more natural, and Christ's character more evident.

As we journey together as a church family, may we commit ourselves again to the rhythm of study. John Wesley once said that he was a *homo unius libri*—"a man of one book." By this, he meant that the Scriptures were his primary source of life, faith, and practice. While he read widely, he was shaped most deeply by the Word of God. In the same way, let us be a people of one book.


