From the beginning, God's people have been called to be welcoming to all. In Leviticus, the Israelites were told to love the stranger as themselves, remembering that they too had once been strangers in Egypt. Jesus made that command personal through the story of The Good Samaritan, showing that true compassion always crosses boundaries. The early church lived this out by meeting daily in homes, breaking bread, and caring for one another with "glad and generous hearts." Their hospitality was a visible daily practice. Through that visible love, the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

Hospitality is love made visible. It is faith taking on flesh through kindness, generosity, and presence. When we open our hearts, homes, and church doors to others, we reflect the heart of God Himself—a God who continually welcomes, feeds, forgives, and restores. Hospitality is not simply about entertaining; it is about embodying grace. It's the way we say with our actions, "You matter. You belong. There is room for you here." It is where we preach a living sermon about God's love.

John Wesley and his followers understood this deeply. They took the gospel to the streets, fields, and prisons, turning hospitality into mission. They want all to come into the spiritual house of God's Spirit to experience transformation and wholeness. Wesley called this "social holiness"—a faith that refuses to remain private, because love, by its nature, must move outward.

Over these last seven weeks as we have explored the house of God's work in us, we are not meant to enter the house never to return to the world. The same Spirit of God leads us out to invite others to come inside to experience His love. When we practice God's hospitality, we join God in His ongoing welcome of the world. The lights of God's house are on, the door is open, and there is room for all.

Green is the color of Ordinary Time, symbolizing life, growth, and hope. Just as plants grow in sunlight and rain, green reminds us that God is always at work—nurturing our faith, deepening our roots, and helping us grow in grace each day.
