LITURGICAL COLOR: GREEN

Green is the color of Ordinary Time, representing life, growth, and hope. Even as the days grow shorter and leaves begin to turn, green reminds us that God is always at work, nurturing our faith, and helping us grow in grace each day—just as plants continue to thrive in sunlight and rain.

Today's Sunday School Lesson for Preschool and Elementary Children Crossing the Sea (Exodus 13:17-14:31) Anchor Point – We remember God's powerful acts. Say the Bible verse together: "I'll set you free with great power." (Exodus 6:6)

Questions for family discussion: When the Israelites left Egypt, they were leaving a life of slavery. You would think this would have made them happy! But the Israelites were afraid. Think about a time you started at a new school, began a new activity, or moved to a new place. How does it feel to do something new? What feels good about new things? What is difficult about starting something new? No matter what you are doing, you can trust God to be with you. God will help you find a way. What or who helps you remember God's presence? How does it feel to know God is with you?
