What is gratitude and how do we find it? I've wrestled with this question for some time because I like a step-by-step approach to things. If I do A and B, then I get C. However, where gratitude is concerned, it may have more to do with vision than strategy- a vision where one begins with the end in mind. Spiritually, the gospel "end" is Christlikeness.

Gratitude, then, is not the destination after things work out; it is the posture that keeps us aligned with the one who knows the end from the beginning. Paul's words to the Thessalonians remind us that giving thanks in all circumstances is not a technique for better living, but an act of trust in God. To "begin with the end in mind" means to fix our eyes on Jesus, "the founder and perfecter of our faith" (Hebrews 12:2), and to let that vision shape how we walk, wait, and worship.

Our gratitude falters when we assume we must understand how it works. We think, "I'll be thankful when...when the prayer is answered, when the plan succeeds, or when the path makes sense." However, Proverbs 3:5-6 reminds us to "Trust in the Lord with all your heart...In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will direct your paths." This calls us to release our grip on the details of direction. The spiritual life is not a project to manage, but a life based in trust. Gratitude, then, is not a step-by-step program, but a worldview shift—a reorientation from self-reliance to surrender. When we insist on understanding before we thank, we delay joy. But when we choose thanksgiving before clarity, we open ourselves to grace that transforms confusion into communion. Thomas à Kempis wrote, "Be thankful in everything, for this is the way to increase grace." Gratitude grows not by planning our blessings, as if we could actually do so, but by perceiving God's hand already at work in things.

Instead of strategizing to get to a place of gratitude, look for the ways God is already blessing. Look for the people and places that are already incarnations of God's redemption in the world. Begin with the end in mind and let go of how you get there.
