Advent marks the beginning of the Christian year—a four-week season of anticipation leading us to the celebration of Christ's birth and the hope of His return. The word Advent comes from the Latin adventus, meaning "arrival" or "coming." The earliest Christians observed Advent as both preparation and longing: preparation for the incarnation and longing for the day when Christ will make all things new. Over the centuries, the Church has kept these weeks as a sacred time to slow down, lift our eyes above the noise, and remember that God enters our world not on our schedule but in his timing.

Throughout church history, Advent was shaped by reflection, fasting, and prayer. It was a counter-rhythm to the frantic pace of ordinary life. The early Church understood something we often forget: to wait is to trust. To wait is to confess that salvation is not something we manufacture but something we receive. Advent invites us to step away from the hurried frenzy of a world obsessed with instant results and immediate gratification. It teaches us that God's promises unfold steadily, quietly, and faithfully often in the hidden places long before they become visible.

This makes the discipline of waiting one of the most powerful acts of spiritual resistance we can offer. In a culture that praises speed, productivity, and constant motion, choosing to wait becomes a holy protest. It is the declaration that our worth is not measured by how fast we move. It is the reminder that God is not rushed and neither must we be. Waiting stretches our hearts, clears our vision, and trains us to see God's grace at work in ways we would otherwise miss because we are too busy.

When we learn to wait, something inside us begins to shift. We discover we are less angry and less reactive because waiting teaches us to trust rather than control. Therefore, we are more at peace because stillness roots us in God's presence rather than the pressure of our circumstances. We become more ready to love, because unhurried hearts have room for compassion, patience, and joy. Advent forms this posture within us, one candle, one prayer, one week at a time. May this season awaken in us the courage to slow down, the faith to wait well, and the hope that Christ—our long-expected One—will meet us in the waiting.
