Fourth Sunday of Advent

John's Gospel doesn't begin with angels or shepherds. It begins with eternity. *"In the beginning was the Word..."* Then, astonishingly, *"the Word became flesh and dwelt among us."* In these few words, John unveils the mystery of Advent: the eternal Son of God stepped into skin and bone into our world.

This is not an abstract truth. It's personal. When Jesus became flesh, He didn't take on power or privilege. He entered the world through poverty, obscurity, and weakness. He entered as light into darkness — to a world bound by fear, division, and injustice.

That's what makes the lyric from *O Holy Night* so fitting for this Sunday: *"Chains shall He break, for the slave is our brother."* The Incarnation breaks the barriers we build. The eternal Word became human to declare that every human bears the image of God, and every soul is worthy of redemption.

John tells us, *"He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him. But to all who did receive Him... He gave the right to become children of God."* The dignity of Christ's humanity lifts the dignity of all humanity. In Christ, the true light gives light to everyone for it shines in the darkness, but the darkness could not overcome it.

Advent reminds us that the Incarnation is not about escaping the world — it's about God entering fully into it. Jesus didn't avoid the mess. He moved toward it. In Christ, God moves into our neighborhood. As we draw near to Christmas, the world still aches under chains of loneliness, despair, and brokenness. However, we sing, not as wishful thinkers, but as truth-bearers: *in His name, all oppression shall cease.*
