Time is one of God's most precious gifts—and one of the easiest to misplace. We often give our best hours, energy, and attention to lesser things, while the things that matter most are left for “later.” In the rush of daily life, we can end up majoring in the minors, filling our calendars without ever asking whether our time reflects what we truly value.

In Ephesians 5, Paul reminds us that we were once darkness, but now we are light in the Lord. Because of who we are, we are called to live wisely, making the best use of our time. Scripture doesn't invite us to be busier; it invites us to be wiser. Wisdom begins when we learn to see our days clearly, to count them rightly, and to offer them back to God with intention.

As part of our All In series, today we reflect on what it means to be All In with our time. Rather than squeezing God into an already crowded schedule, we are invited to let God shape the way our days are lived—so that our time, like our lives, becomes an act of worship. — Rev. Dr. Shane Green

*Faithful God, you have called us your own and redeemed us through Jesus Christ. In response to your mercy and grace, we come to offer ourselves to you.
