Lent offers a unique opportunity to slow down and examine the deeper aspects of our lives. More than just a time for giving things up, Lent invites us to explore the root causes of our habits, attitudes, and behaviors. This spiritual season encourages us to look inward and ask important questions about why we do what we do, how we respond to others, and what drives our choices. It is in this searching that patience becomes not only necessary but transformative. The process of uncovering what lies beneath the surface of our lives takes time, care, and intentional space—qualities that patience fosters.

Patience itself is often misunderstood as mere waiting or passive endurance. In truth, patience is an active virtue—one that requires strength, self-control, and deep humility. It is the ability to hold space for growth, for healing, and for change, both in ourselves and in others. In a fast-paced, social media dominated, results-driven culture, the need for patience has never been greater. We are often quick to judge, react, or demand immediate solutions, but Lent reminds us that real transformation is slow, quiet, and often hidden. Without patience, we risk missing the subtle movements of grace in our lives.

When we practice patience with others, we are practicing love. Choosing to be patient is choosing to honor the person in front of us—their struggles, their imperfections, their story. It is a refusal to reduce people to their worst moments or their slow progress. In this way, patience becomes an act of compassion. It allows us to walk with others instead of rushing ahead or pushing them from behind. It is love stretched out over time, steady and unwavering.

During Lent, we are invited not only to deepen our faith but also to widen our hearts. As we examine our inner lives and confront uncomfortable truths, we are called to offer the same gentleness to others that we hope to receive ourselves. Patience becomes both a guide and a gift, shaping how we relate to God, ourselves, and those around us. Through patience, Lent becomes more than a ritual—it becomes a path of love.
